**CLASS XII RESULT 2022 EXAMINATIONS**

**DATE:- 22.07.2022**

**A SPECIAL ACADEMIC SESSION, 2021-2022:**

Since 2020, school education has been severely affected because of the spread of the COVID pandemic. In 2020 and 2021, the Board declared the result of Class X and Class XII based on the Tabulation Policy approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

During these two years, Board did not have any data on the learning of the students as the Board was unable to conduct all the examinations. Once the activities of the 2020 result were over, the Board started preparations for the 2021-2022 examinations, keeping in view the probability of continuation of the pandemic and the likely impact of the same on studies and assessment of the students of Classes X and XII. Accordingly, the Board decided to conduct the 2022 examinations in two Terms i.e. Term-I & Term-II for the first time in the history of the CBSE. Covid, non-conduct of classes, holding examination two times, conducting an objective type examination, getting the replies on OMRs, evaluation by schools etc. have made this session a special one and thus this session cannot be compared with any of the previous sessions.

**TERM-I EXAMINATIONS**

It was decided that an examination of a short duration of 90 minutes should be conducted with the half syllabus to have a realistic assessment of the students so that if there is any possibility of the spread of the pandemic, the result of the students could be declared based on the performance of Term-I examinations. According to the decision, Term-I examinations of Class-XII were conducted from 16.11.2021 to 30.12.2021 and Class X examinations were conducted from 17.11.2021 to 11.12.2021 at 13350 examination centres spread over India and in 26 countries abroad by strictly maintaining the Covid protocols. CBSE conducted the examination of 114 subjects in Class XII and 74 subjects in class X. The performance of the students was also communicated to them through schools.

## **TERM-II EXAMINATIONS**

In Term II , other half of the syllabus was fixed for the assessment by holding an examination of 2/1Hrs each for different subjects. Term-II, class-XII examinations were conducted from 26.04.2022 TO 15.06.2022 and Class X examinations were conducted from 26.04.2022 to 24.05.2022 at 7405 centres. In Term II also, CBSE conducted the examination of 114 subjects in Class-XII and 74 subjects in Class-X. Looking into the adverse impact of Covid on the conduct of classes and availability of short time, the date sheets of both the classes were also prepared in such a manner that students have sufficient time between two examinations for preparations. Term II examinations were conducted for 51 days.

## **COVID COMPLIED EXAMINATIONS**

CBSE made elaborate arrangements for holding both Term-I and Term-II examinations by strictly following the Covid protocols keeping in mind the safety of students and school staff. The scheme of examination was fully covid complied. In the interest of the safety of students and staff, CBSE gave the following special fund to the schools:

1. Rs. 5000/- to each 13369 examination centres for purchasing an Infrared thermometer. CBSE has spent about Rs. 11 Crore on this account in both Term I and Term II.
2. Rs. 5/- per student per day for both classes-X and XII for 35 lakh candidates for purchasing hand sanitiser, soap, masks dustbin etc. CBSE has spent about Rs. 10.66 Crore on this account in both Term I and Term II.
3. Rs. 3/- per candidate per day for providing water to the students because of Covid and peak summer in Term-II. CBSE has spent about Rs. 6.5 Crore on this account in Term II.

## **Rationalised SYLLABUS:-**

CBSE rationalized the syllabus by 30% because of the loss of transactional time on account of Covid in this session. This was then equally distributed in the two term examinations to facilitate more focused learning and reducing examination related stress among the students.

### **WEIGHTAGE OF TERM – I AND TERM – II EXAMINATION:-**

The predominant feedback received after Term-I (Theory) exams was that students were unable to perform to their full potential in the Term-I examinations as they had to appear for an objective pattern for the first time in board exams without any adequate precedent and practice. The predominant feedback for Term II exams was more positive, with satisfactory performance being expressed by the students. The board sought the views of a large number of school Principals and officials, through a consultative mechanism, on the relative weightage to be given for the two terms, to arrive at a composite final result.

Majority of the members of the committee recommended that the weightage for Term-I (Theory) should be around 30% and for Term-II (Theory) 70% respectively. As far as Practical is concerned, equal weightage of both Term I and Term II be given.

The Competent Committee of the Board deliberated at length on the discussions of the committee. It was decided to accept the recommendations and the weightage of Term-I was fixed at 30%, and Term-II 70% for theory papers. However, for practical, equal weightage was decided to be given for both Terms for preparing the final result of both class X and Class XII.

### **EXTRAORDINARY DECISION BY THE CBSE**

1. CBSE, provided an opportunity to the students of both classes X and XII after the performance of Term I was informed to them that if they are not satisfied with their marks, they can inform the same to the CBSE through their schools. All the cases received by the CBSE of both the classes were processed and the following decisions have been taken by the CBSE: -
  - (a) Wherever marks have increased after recheck, these have been taken into consideration for preparing the final result.
  - (b) In case, the marks have been reduced, old i.e. higher marks have been taken into consideration in preparing the final result.

These decisions were taken by looking into the special circumstances under which Term-I exams were conducted. All the requests received were considered and decided and thereafter final results were prepared.

2. The results of the following category of students who could not appear for both Term I and II, have been prepared and declared based on their performance in either term of the examinations in which they appeared:-

- (a) Students who suffered from Covid in any of the Term I or Term II examinations
  - (b) Students who participated in the National/ International sports
  - (c) Students who participated in International Olympiad
  - (d) Students who were in the containment zone
  - (e) Students who were in quarantine
3. Some cases of unfair means were reported both in Classes X and XII in both the Terms. Serious cases have been penalized as per Boards rules.

#### **AVAILABILITY OF DOCUMENTS TO THE STUDENTS:**

As soon as the result is declared, the result documents have been provided to the students in their DigiLocker. To avoid the problem of accessing the DigiLocker, this year, CBSE has provided the PIN to the schools in advance, to be given to the candidates ahead of result declaration.

Further, this year again, Board will be supplying Printed Marksheets cum Passing Certificates also to the students in addition to electronic documents.

#### **MATHEMATICS IN CLASS XI TO THE STUDENTS OF CLASS X OFFERED MATHEMATICS (BASIC)**

This year again, Board has decided that because of special circumstances, students who have offered Mathematics (Basic) in Class X are allowed to offer Mathematics in Class XI. In this regard, a detailed circular is being issued by the Board shortly.

#### **MERIT CERTIFICATE TO THE STUDENTS**

This year, the board will issue the merit certificate to <sup>0.1%</sup>~~1%~~ of students who have scored the highest marks in the subjects. However, as per the earlier decision of the Board to avoid unhealthy competition amongst the students, no merit list will be declared. In this regard, it is also informed that Board is not awarding first, second or third division to its students.

#### **VERIFICATION, PHOTOCOPY, AND RE-EVALUATION OF TERM-II EXAMINATION**

CBSE will also provide facilities to the students as provided in earlier years of getting their marks verified, obtaining photocopy, and the re-evaluation. In this regard, a notice is being issued separately.

### **IMPROVEMENT OPPORTUNITY IN THE COMPARTMENT EXAMINATION:-**

As it is envisaged in the National Education Policy, 2020 that students should be provided more opportunities to improve their performance, hence, Class XII students will be allowed to improve their performance in 01 subject in the compartment examination. For all the students who are placed in the Compartment Category, the Compartment examination will be conducted from 23.08.2022. Compartment examinations would be held on the syllabus of Term-II examinations.

Further, the students who offered 6 or more subjects and were not able to pass in any of the first 5 subjects except language, declared pass by replacing 6<sup>th</sup> subject from the failed subject are also allowed in Compartment Examination to improve the performance in the failed subject.

### **DATE OF 2023 MAIN EXAMINATIONS:-**

In the light of lessening of impact of the Covid pandemic across the globe, the Board has decided to conduct 2023 examinations from the 15<sup>th</sup> of February 2023.

### **SPECIAL SUPPORT AND THUS RECOGNITION**

Holding both the Terms examinations and the assessment successfully become possible only because of the hard and selfless work done by the Management, Principals, and Teachers/ Staff of the affiliated schools. Despite risks to personal self they came out from their homes,, conducted classes, performed duty in examinations, and evaluated the OMRs and Answer Books. A grateful thanks and appreciation to everyone.

Another section that supported the successful conduct of examinations is the real stakeholders i.e. students and their parents. They followed all the instructions passed by CBSE strictly and maintained discipline. Their support is well recognized by the CBSE.

CBSE is extremely grateful to the governments of the countries where CBSE has its examination centres, for supporting CBSE in the face of the challenges arising out of the pandemic. CBSE is equally grateful to the India Mission abroad who selflessly

supported CBSE and its student tirelessly during Covid and in the smooth conduct of the examinations.

CBSE is thankful to the Central and State Government officials for extending their support in the smooth conduct of examinations.

Media friends deserve a big thanks for placing facts before the nation and supporting CBSE in disseminating information which was helpful in the conduct of examination during Covid.

### **USE OF TECHNOLOGY:-**

Extensive use of technology, facilitated the conduct of 2 examinations in 2021-2022, In the following activities, technology was used in the form of apps developed inhouse:-

1. “**परीक्षा संगम-** ” -Recently launched Comprehensive Platform for all examination-related activities pertaining to all major stakeholders including schools, Regional Offices and Head Office.
2. An online portal for schools to register all students of Class IX & XI including online fee payment and generation registration cards were developed & implemented. Registration cards are also being provided to the students through Digi Locker.
3. Initially all the examination forms were obtained online through the schools for both the classes X and XII. An online portal for schools to finalise list of candidates (**LOC**) likely to appear for Class X & XII based on last year’s IX & XI registration data including online fee payment were developed & implemented.
4. **ECL - Exam Centre Locater App:** A mobile app to facilitate CBSE Examinees of both Board as well competitive exams, through which they can locate their examination centres by just entering exam and roll no. was

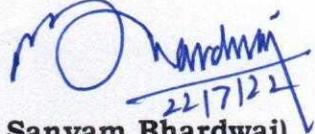
developed & implemented. This mobile app also guides them to reach the exam centre by giving shortest route based on real time traffic data.

5. This year, Board has provided subject-wise and student-wise OMR sheets for the Term-I examination online. Schools were instructed to download the OMR in advance. No candidate was supposed to fill in their details in the OMR. A System for real time OMR generation (**OMG**) for TERM 1 Board exam 2021-2022 was developed and implemented.
6. **OEQPD (Online Encrypted Question Paper Delivery System):** A system for just in time encryption, dissemination, decryption of encrypted and printing of question papers for instant and secure delivery of QP. In 2021 (Term 1 Exam) of 2022 all QPs were sent in encrypted format, which resulted just in time availability of QP and huge saving of logistic expenditure and to many of carbon footprints. Hence, arrangements were made to supply the question papers online to 13370 examination centres.
7. **OCAU (Online Correct Answers Upload):** For the Term 1 Board exam a system was developed and implemented for immediate upload of correct answers after evaluation of OMR Sheets.
8. **OECMS (Online Exam Centre Management System):** Comprehensive Decision Support System comprising of a portal and backend system to get real time information about centres and conduct of exams including feedback about the question paper(s), packing of answer books & dispatch, information about Observers etc.
9. **CMTM – (Confidential Material Tracking & Monitoring system) Apps for Board Exams:** Three different Apps have been developed for electronic surveillance, tracking and monitoring. With the help of this app, the arrangements were made to call the examination centres immediately if they were not following instructions issued by the Board.

10. In order to eradicate non genuine disbursement, an Online Normative Payment System “**(IPS) Integrated Payment System**”. This is in consonance of Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) and Ease of Living (EoL). It has also been implemented for DBT of remuneration to all Board Exams functionaries including Centre Supdt, invigilators, support staff, evaluators etc.
11. **Use of Advanced data analytics/data forensic to ensure fairness in CBSE** - CBSE decided to use advanced data analytics for smooth and fair conduct of examination. This was successfully implemented in 2022 Board Exams.
12. **E-Theory**: An online system for answer sheets’ bag allocation to Chief Nodal Supervisor, answer sheets allocation to evaluators, evaluation monitoring, question-wise theory marks uploading and online generation of award lists has been developed & implemented. During evaluation all the marks were uploaded directly to the website.
13. **TETra (Theory Evaluation Trend Analysis)** -Decision Support System based on Real Time Evaluation Monitoring- A unique portal and Decision Support System based on Real Time Evaluation Monitoring has been developed. In this system evaluation trend can be visualized, analysed and monitored. This also generates various statistical data and gives graphical visualisation of evaluation related information in real time.
14. **School Request Submission for Resolution (SRSR) Portal**- Development & Implementation of Online dispute redressal mechanism for Board examination. Through this portal disputes raised by the students/schools may be resolved by CBSE in scheduled period. This was successfully implemented for term 1 & term 2 Board Examination 2021-2022.

15. In order to further strengthen security & privacy of students' data, it has been decided to introduce 6-digit **Security PIN** based activation for students' DigiLocker accounts. After activation of DigiLocker accounts, students can access their Digital Academic Documents under the 'Issued Documents' section. The student wise Security PIN file is being given in Schools in their DigiLocker accounts from where schools can download and disseminate Security PIN to individual students.

16. Since DigiLocker access is not available in foreign countries, so special provision for foreign students to Access of Digital Academic Documents (Mark sheet Cum Certificates & Migration Certificates) by students of CBSE schools located in foreign countries.

Students can download mobile app from Google Play (<https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.digilocker.android>) or Apple App Store (<https://apps.apple.com/in/app/digilocker/id1320618078>) to access their certificates.
3. **In order to further strengthen security & privacy of students' data, it has been decided to introduce 6-digit Security PIN based activation for students' DigiLocker accounts. After activation of DigiLocker accounts, students can access their Digital Academic Documents under the 'Issued Documents' section. The student wise Security PIN file is being given in Schools in their DigiLocker accounts from where schools can download and disseminate Security PIN to individual students.**

  - After that, candidates DigiLocker account shall be activated → upon successful confirmation → Click on "Go to DigiLocker account"
